1. According to U.S. Census data, it is estimated that earnings of naturalized citizens can increase by 8 to 11 percent.
2. During the last decade, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) welcomed more than 6.6 million naturalized citizens to our country.
3. In 2014, Baltimore was home to roughly 9,000 individuals who are eligible to become U.S. citizens.

3. Have access to federal jobs.
4. Can become an elected official.
5. Are eligible for federal benefits.
6. Have fewer restrictions on international travel.
